1½ yards white background fabric

3 yards fusible web

1 layer cake

batting

⅔ yard border fabric

stabilizer

½ yard binding fabric

compass

3 yards backing fabric

Circle Quilt

Circle Quilt

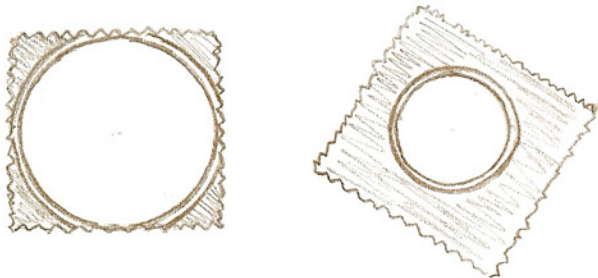
Read through complete pattern instructions before starting | Use a ¼" seam allowance unless specified

Supplies

- 1½ yards white background fabric
- 1 layer cake
- ⅔ yard border fabric
- ½ yard binding fabric
- 3 yards backing fabric
- 3 yards fusible web
- batting
- stabilizer
- compass

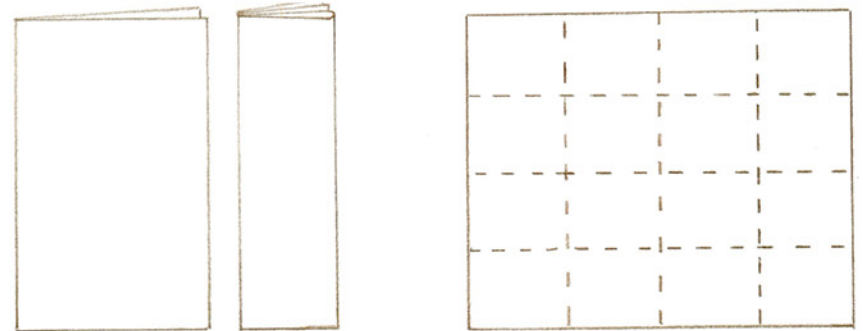
Instructions

- 1 Using a compass draw the following circle sizes on to the smooth side of fusible web, leaving ¼" spacing between circles. Cut circles out leaving about ⅛" surrounding each circle.
 - 4 (10") circles
 - 2 (8") circles
 - 4 (7") circles
 - 6 (6") circles
 - 5 (5") circles
 - 5 (4") circles
 - 6 (3") circles
- 2 Follow the manufacturer's instructions to adhere a circle on the wrong side of 32 different layer cake fabric squares. Cut the circles out on their drawn lines. Peel off paper backings of circles.



- 3 Cut background fabric to measure 36 ½", with selvages positioned on each side. Now cut selvaged edges so that the width of the background measures 40 ½".
- 4 Fold background fabric in half widthwise, and lightly press the fold. Fold the background widthwise again and press fold. Unfold background fabric. Now fold and press background fabric lengthwise, using the same procedure.

NOTE : The fold lines will help with circle placement.



- 5 Position and temporarily pin all circles on to background fabric using the placement chart as a guide. Then follow the manufacturer's instructions to fuse circles to the background, working in sections until all circles are attached.

Appliqué

Machine appliqué around each circle, placing stabilizer behind the quilt, one circle at a time as you sew. We used a blanket stitch.

NOTE : *Appliqué the circles that are tucked under other circles first. Only appliqué circle edges that are visible.*

Borders

Cut 2 border strips $3\frac{1}{4}'' \times 36\frac{1}{2}''$. Sew strips to the quilt sides, and press the seams towards the borders. Cut 2 strips $3\frac{1}{4}'' \times 46''$. Sew strips to quilt top and bottom, and press the seams towards the borders.

Layer, pin, and quilt as desired.
